When to Call for Inspection of Small Buildings

(For all Buildings Included in Part 9 of the Ontario Building Code)

	Footings: At completion of formwork, before pouring concrete Foundations*: At completion	
	Structural framing*: At completion, including rough-in of plumbing and HVAC Fire separations: At completion of wall, floor and shaft separations and fire stopping,	
	before installing interior finishes Insulation and vapour barrier: At completion of insulation & vapour barrier, and before installing interior services	
	Fireplaces, gas appliances, and chimneys: At the commencement of installation Occupancy: Consult your inspector

Rough-in HVAC**/air extraction: At completion of rough-in, before installation of insulation
Rough-in kitchen exhaust system (non-residential): At completion of rough-in before
operation of the system
Occupancy: Mechanical systems ready for testing

4. Closing Permits
Final Inspections: At the project completion, required to close the permit.
When to Call for Inspection of Large Buildings
For all Buildings Included in Part 3 of the Ontario Building Code)
1. Building Inspections
Footings: At completion of formwork, before pouring concrete
Foundations: At completion Structural frame in at At the completion of atmost and frame in a few pools at a result.
 Structural framing: At the completion of structural framing for each storey Fire separations and closures: At completion of framing for wall, floor and shaft fire
separations, including closures, continuity, and fire stopping and before applying the
interior finishes, spray fireproofing and lay-in tiles to ceilings
☐ Insulation and vapour/air barrier: At completion of insulation & vapour/air barrier and
before installation of interior services
☐ Fireplaces, gas appliances, and chimneys: At the commencement of installation
☐ Life safety systems: At completion of rough-in of the safety systems - referral to Toronto
Fire Prevention
Occupancy: Consult your inspector
Final interior inspection: At completion of interior construction, life safety systems and
all fire separations and enclosures
Final exterior inspection: At completion of grading, exterior finishes, fire routes, parking,
hydrants and site amenities
